## Research profile

My research focuses on the formal treatment of natural language semantics at its interface with syntax and morphology. I am interested in understanding the ontology of natural language and the way in which languages express definiteness, countability and reference in both the eventuality and nominal domain. My aim is to connect specific language phenomena to general laws, by following a comparative and theoretically informed perspective. My studies are based on the qualitative analysis of elicited data as well as on a quantitative and qualitative analysis of modern language corpora.

Together, the comparative research methodology that I privilege and the broad topic of investigating nominal and verbal parameters in Romance, foster the understanding of the micro- and macro-variation across Romance varieties, and shed a light on the relation between functional categories and semantic interpretation in a more general perspective. Some issues that I have investigated more specifically are :

- the contribution of aspect to the empirical phenomenon of event plurality. This work started with my PhD dissertation, defended in 2008, where I studied a number of adverbial markers across languages that I subsumed under a class defined by the theoretical notion of ‘event repetition’. I developed a comparative

perspective across Romance languages (Tovena & Donazzan 2008, Donazzan & Mardale 2010). In this perspective, I then extended the investigation to other related phenomena :

- the aspectual contribution of object noun phrases with different referential properties, with particular focus on bare nouns and weak indefinites in Romance (Donazzan & Gritti 2012) ;
- event identification and pluralisation in pluractional and non-pluractional languages, through a formalisation of the semantic contribution of reduplication (Donazzan & Müller 2015, Müller, Donazzan & Sanchez-Mendes submitted) and of functional aspectual markers (Donazzan 2012) ;
- the semantics of Time and the contribution of temporal and aspectual adverbs to the interpretation of sentences, in Italian and French (Donazzan & Becker to appear, Becker & Donazzan submitted) and in broader comparative perspective (Donazzan, Schwer & Tovena 2010, Jasinskaja, Chiriacescu, Donazzan et al. 2015) ;
- the referential properties of weak determiner phrases in Italian (Donazzan 2013a, Donazzan 2013b) and in French (Cangemi, Becker, Donazzan et al. 2015, Becker, Donazzan, Cangemi et al. 2015), looking in particular at the role played by contextual information such as frame setting and familiarity entailments ;
- event nominalisations and complex predicates in Italian. I focus in particular on the case of event nouns that refer to specific occurrences of events (*nomina vicis*), with the aim of refining this semantic characterisation and of comparing Italian event nouns to other Romance nominalisations (Donazzan & Tovena to appear (a) ; Donazzan & Tovena to appear (b)).

(tsubmitted, 10/2016) *Nominal and verbal events in Romance causative constructions  
and the semantics of (in)direct causation*

This project is about the syntax and semantics of non-lexical causative constructions in Romance languages. We will analyse causative constructions by relating their syntactic complexity to the semantics of causation, focussing in particular on the distinction between direct and indirect causal relations. Our hypothesis is that the direct/indirect causation parameter is related to the syntactic and semantic expression of the participants of the caused event(s). While previous work applied the (in)direct causation parameter to account for the structural difference between lexical (synthetic) and periphrastic (analytic) causatives, this project investigates causative relations expressed by distinct types of periphrastic constructions : (i) light-verb constructions where the causative verb embeds an event noun (It. *fare una dormita* lit. ‘make a sleeping’) ; (ii) factitive causative constructions, where the causative verb embeds an infinitive clause (It. *fare dormire i bambini* ‘make the children sleep’).

Romance synthetic causative structures have intriguing properties that have made them the subject of several outstanding studies in the past. Yet, with the exception of Vecchiato (2011), the interpretation of these constructions with respect to the semantics of causative relations has never been explored in a systematic way. This project aims at filling this gap, and proposes an analysis of syntactic causative constructions in Romance that addresses the issue of semantic composition at the interface with syntax. The comparison with complex light verb constructions, which are still relatively understudied, offers a new approach to the study of causative structures in Romance, comparing different syntactic constructions (factitives and light-verb constructions) and accounting for the micro-variation across Romance varieties in a systematic way.

#### *Delimiting and identifying events (DelimitEvent)*

Founded by the Fédération Typologie et Universaux du Langage

The project explores the issue of the identification of events as countable and measurable entities. We start from the consideration that the realisation of the properties that are accessible to functional operators for counting and measuring, traditionally defined on a temporal dimension, are not uniformly available across languages, or can be encoded in a different way at the interface with morphosyntax. A particular problem is posed by complex structures made of sub-events that are defined on causal or functional, non-temporal relations. The project gathers a network of researchers, specialists of different languages, whose contributions focus on the cross-linguistic comparison of event modifiers, and in particular on the following empirical phenomena : morpho-phonological marking of the verb ; verbal classifiers and co-verbs ; adverbs and adverbials with presuppositional and aspectual content ; event nominalisations.

#### *Semantic variation. Event plurality in Chinese and Karitiana* Founded by the Centro National da Pesquisa (CNPq), Brazil. Co-directed with Ana Müller (Universidade de São Paulo)

In this project, we compare strategies of event pluralisation in two unrelated languages, Mandarin Chinese (Sino-Tibetan) and Karitiana (Arikém, Tupi), which display determiner-less nouns and make productive use of reduplication across lexical categories, albeit with distinct semantic values. The aim is to understand the parametric differences related to morphological marking in the two languages, so as to account for semantic variation in a systematic way.

## Teaching profile

During my training as a PhD student and in the years after my PhD, I had the opportunity to work as a teacher in university in France and Germany, at various levels, being in relation with students coming from different social and academic backgrounds.

I had the opportunity of teaching courses related to various aspects of language learning, and this experience proved to be very important for defining my own philosophy of teaching, which is the reflection of the view that I have of linguistics and of the role of academia in promoting knowledge and research.

During my service as a lecturer at Paris 7 and Paris 8, I have been teaching French grammar (focussing on syntax and semantics, and also on morpho-phonology and phonetics) and French stylistics. My courses addressed students of French for Second Language Learners (*Français Langue Etrangère*), foreign students and students of literature and arts. More recently, as part of my teaching service in Cologne, I also delivered one course focussing on comparative Romance linguistics, looking in particular at variation in the syntax and semantics of noun phrases across Romance (at the Romanisches Seminar); a further comparative course on the syntactic and morphological differences between Romance and Germanic languages is planned for the students of the English and German departments for the upcoming semester. My experience in the Romanisches Seminar at Cologne University also features a course on word order in French, in which I addressed the issue of word order variation in the perspective of grammar and of stylistics.

My experience of teaching in the German academia introduced me also to the task of supporting and evaluating research work done by students at a very early stage of their curricula, such as term papers and class reports (*Hausarbeiten* and *Referate*). In this occasion, I was also lead to help students developing the ability to structure a text or a presentation with a scientific argumentation, to find sources and to be confident in their judgments. In this perspective, I could rely on the experience that I acquired in teaching writing skills and scientific argumentation in my previous position in France. Altogether, this part of my teaching duties strengthened my belief on the importance and adequacy of the methodology that I use in lecturing.
